Dear Parents,

Thank you for encouraging your child to help support our community by getting involved in Pathways for Exceptional Children's **Mentor Program**. Pathways has received statewide recognition for our successful, innovative programs and activities that offer children opportunities to perform community service and gain the invaluable

experience of mentoring another child. We do our best to match up our children with special needs with our trained mentors based on many factors including schedules, interests, and requests.

The Mentor Program starts with a two-hour training workshop that provides mentors with the skills needed to work with children with many types of disabilities. Mentors receive a monthly newsletter listing current programs and activities. To participate, they need to sign up by email, mentor4pathways@yahoo.com or phone, **973-856-9587** and we will follow up with a confirmation. Mentors are responsible for checking in at every session to log in their hours. If they will be absent, they should contact us to let us know. Certificates are awarded with the total hours of community service at the end of the programs. All this information is available in the *Mentor News* or on our website, www.PathwaysKids.org.

Program Descriptions

Recreation Programs

Time Commitment: 1-2 hours weekly for 4-6 weeks

Description: Mentors work together with children and a coach or instructor in noncompetitive team sports, art, music, reading, or recreational activities. Good choice for a mentor who likes a supervised group environment. Number of mentors is based on attendance and program needs. If field trip is included, bus transportation outside of Montville requires signed permission by the parent. Adult supervision is always provided either by individuals employed and/or contracted by Montville Township Recreation Dept to run the programs, or private entities where programs take place.

Home-Based Buddies Program

Time Commitment: One year of unlimited visits on a schedule designed by mentor and family of child

Description: A mentor is matched with one specific child and visits their home to provide companionship. Good choice for a mentor who wants a one-on-one environment with a flexible schedule. The parent of the child with special needs signs a written agreement that the Home-Based Buddies Program is NOT for babysitting purposes.

The mentor spends time at the child's home on a volunteer basis. This agreement also requires that the parent* remain on the premises to train the mentor involved with their child and supervise all activities for an enjoyable and successful experience for both children. If at any time the parent* fails to follow this agreement, they will forfeit use of the program. The mentor's parent is welcome at any time to call the child's parent, meet with the family, and/or accompany the mentor to their home until they feel comfortable with the mentor staying there alone. The parent* takes full responsibility for supervising the mentor during this time.

Disclaimer: The Montville Recreation Department and Pathways for Exceptional Children cannot provide direct supervision of mentors during the Home-Based Buddies Program, nor can they assume legal responsibility of any kind during this time. As the children become friends, the families may choose to spend time together outside of the home. Pathways is encouraged to see friendships evolve, however we cannot assume any responsibility for monitoring or supervising these activities, which are up to the full discretion, supervision, and responsibility of the parents of the children involved.
